General Information on transport to Kindergarten

◆ Responsibility & Application

Transport to a kindergarten that is not within walking distance is organized by the district.

- ➔ The bus pass must be applied for online by the parents and will be stored at the district administration (KV). There are no costs.

◆ Safe Seat

Kindergarten children need a seat with front-facing safety.

- ➔ Boarding and exiting is only allowed through the front door. Rear doors remain closed.

◆ Kindergarten Bus ID Card

Every child should carry their filled-out Kindergarten Bus ID (red or green) and be able to show it to the bus driver on request. (More information on the district administration website under „Beförderung zum Kindergarten“ → „Kita-Bus-Ausweis“)

◆ Free Accompanying Rides

For familiarization and in case of problems, free accompanying rides are possible.

◆ Complaints and Feedback

If problems arise, there is a regulated complaints procedure. Kindergarten, bus drivers or bus companies are NOT the right contact.

The Bus Stop: Important notes for parents

- 🚫 Do not park at the bus stop when dropping off or picking up your child

- ➔ This blocks the bus and endangers children when boarding or exiting.

- 👁️ Do not wait on the opposite side of the street

- ➔ Children may run across the street without checking traffic.

- 🕒 Punctuality with red Kindergarten Bus ID

Please be at the stop on time if your child has a red Kindergarten Bus ID.

- ➔ The bus runs on a fixed schedule and must bring other children home on time.

- ✅ Give your child the green ID if you allow them to walk home from the stop on their own.

Boarding the bus

- ✓ Leave home on time
- Children who are rushed pay less attention to traffic.
- ✓ Place bags in order
- This makes it clear who boards first and avoids pushing.
- ✓ Keep a safe distance from the curb (at least 1 m)
- The front corner of the bus may swing out.
- ✗ Do not push against the bus door
- Otherwise it cannot open.
- ✗ No pushing or shoving
- Risk of injury.
- ✓ Children should board by themselves whenever possible
- If parents accompany the child to their seat, they should leave the bus quickly. Timetables must be kept.
- ✓ Only use front-facing seats with safety measures. If necessary, the driver may assign seats.
- This makes sure that all children are kept safe.

Behavior on the bus

- ✓ Always remain seated while the bus is moving.
- ✓ Keep your bag between your legs or on your lap.
- Do not place items on the seats – every seat is needed!
- ✗ No eating or drinking during the ride.
- Risk of choking or injury.
- ✗ Do not damage seats (no holes, chewing gum or drawing).
- The bus must stay clean and intact.
- ✗ Do not remove emergency hammers!
- They are for emergencies only.
- ✓ Report unusual behavior or damage.
- If something is broken or missing, please inform the driver.

Exiting the bus

- ✓ Stay seated until the bus has come to a full stop.
- ✗ No pushing or shoving when exiting.
- ✓ Stand up and exit when the bus reaches the home stop.
- ✓ Look right and left before moving on.
- Watch out for pedestrians and cyclists!
- ✓ Doors have pinch protection
- Don't worry, the door will open automatically if something is in the way.
- ⚠ Cross the street only after the bus has driven away!
- In front of or behind the bus, visibility is limited – danger of accidents!
